

BIBRON'S GECKO

Behavior: This is a fairly uncommon gecko in North America. They come from Southern African and are a diurnal species meaning they are most active during the day. They are also arboreal meaning they will spend most of the time in the trees and off the ground. They have very sensitive skin and have the ability to drop their tail, so should not be handled too much; they are more of a visual pet. They are often found near roads eating all the squished insects.

Experience Level: Intermediate.

Adult Size: 6 to 8 inches.

Life Expectancy:

Ambient Temperature: 75F

Basking Temperature: 90F

Light: Repti-Glo 5.0 plus a heat lamp.

Humidity: 60-70%

Food: Crickets, silkworms, butter worms, will also eat canned or freeze dried crickets.

Minimum Cage Size: 20 gallon.

Habitat: Arboreal, lots of branches and ornaments for it to climb.

Substrate: Bark, mulch.

Maintenance: Replace the water and clean feces once a day. A full cage cleaning should be done once a month.

Basic Requirements: Enclosure with a secure lid, heat lamp, undertank heater, water bowl, thermometer, hygrometer, spray bottle, UV light, substrate, ornament/vegetation/hides, vitamin/mineral supplements.
